1. The playing field cannot support a growth of grass. Yet hardy weeds thrive and make an unsightly appearance. Mowing is impractical, so attach a chain to a six foot length of eye beam. Drawn behind a jeep or truck the eye beam not only makes quick work of the weeds but also helps to level off the field.
2. Also, several box hockey sets arranged over a weedy area will help you get rid of the weeds in short order and kids will have fun while doing it.
